Renovations to the former Coleman Gymnasium turned Mary Channing Coleman Building, the home of UNCG’s School of Dance, began in Spring 2017. As renovations continue, School of Dance performances have been relocated to UNCG Auditorium, following its restoration as a result of fire damage, Greensboro Project Space at 219 W. Lewis Street and the Van Dyke Performance Space, located in the Greensboro Cultural Arts Center at 200 N. Davie Street. The Van Dyke Performance Space, endowed by professor emerita, Jan Van Dyke, in partnership with ArtsGreensboro, serves to expand opportunities for young artists to present their work. The School of Dance and College of Visual and Performing Arts are proud to temporarily share space with the Dance Project, City Arts and other Greensboro-based artists.
